Their boat and equipment must meet CG requirements, including an appropriate signaling device. Paddlers are responsible for their own safety, including dressing for immersion.

If you haven't put a list of emergency equipment together, here's one to consider:

MINIMUM SAFETY EQUIPMENT:

- PFD (& whistle)
- Pump
- Flares
- Charts/compass
- Chart case
- Paddle float
- Extra paddle

ADDITIONAL REQUIRED EQUIPMENT:

- VHF radio
- Parachute flares
- Towing system
- Emergency kit (extra clothes,

sleeping bag, tarp, stove, pot food, blanket, matches, knife)

- Repair kit & tools
- Waterproof flashlight
- Knife (on PFD)
- Water bottles
- Firestarter
- Energy bars or high sugar/carb snack for hypothermia
